
MUSIC PROGRAM

EVENT RECAP DÍA DE LOS MUERTOS: BY SHARON SETO, CHAIR

It was pure joy for me to see all the bright spirited attendees, many in festive attire, coming into San Francisco Symphony's 14th annual Día de Los Muertos event on November 6th. As co-founder of the SF Symphony's Lunar New Year Concert and Banquet, I am incredibly delighted and honored for the opportunity to be involved in celebrating many cultures. The SF Symphony believes in an inclusive approach, and the amazing Día de los Muertos committee supports this value, as do I. We were thrilled that both the Día de los Muertos concert and Fiesta dinner sold out!

The event, presented in partnership with the San Francisco Arts Commission, commenced with a street procession. Concert goers then headed inside Davies to be welcomed by festive sounds of traditional Latin Music, stilt walkers, and colorful catrines y catrinas throughout its halls. Guests can view the placing of photo offerings of the dearly departed atop installations and vibrant interactive altars created by local artists and curated by Martha Rodríguez-Salazar. A sold-out concert of Latin American compositions – led by Enluis Montes Olivar, a 24-year-old Venezuelan conductor phenom in his SFS debut – starred Mexican vocalist Flor Amargo (aka La Reina del Barrio) and SFS concertmaster Alexander Barantschik.

As the event chair, we made a few changes to this wonderful, traditional event! I'm so pleased we successfully transformed a daytime event into an evening event, and had non-member community leaders join the Día de los Muertos Fiesta committee for the first time! This SF Symphony League fete marked the inaugural VIP ¡Fiesta! dinner - featuring an Aroma Buena Catering feast - which enhanced financial support for the Symphony's myriad artistic, education and community programs. As a result, I'm so happy and grateful to share that the SOLD OUT Dinner and auction obtained record-breaking results! The Silent Auction brought in over \$20,000, surpassing goal! Big gratitude to our talented and skillful Día de los Muertos Fiesta committee and our angelic sponsors. It took a village to make this event successful!
