### YOUTH ORCHESTRA NEWS CONTRIBUTED BY SHARON LITSKY

The SFS Youth Orchestra has been awarded the National Endowment for the Arts GAP Music Award of \$60,000, supporting the 2022-23 subscription concerts.

The NEA Grants for Arts program funds "artistically excellent projects that celebrate our creativity and cultural heritage, invite mutual respect for differing beliefs and values, and enrich humanity." This is YO's first NEA award for artistic excellence, though in past years its pre-professional orchestral training program has received more modest funding. Our YO was one of only three American youth orchestras to receive NEA funding in this round, and the two others were granted \$10K and \$25K. Moreover, of the 148 music grants awarded this month, YO's was the second highest - surpassed only by the Sphynx Organization and Philadelphia Symphony Orchestra, which each received \$65,000! Receiving this fully vetted, national recognition confirms what we all know - that even in this transitional, barely post-COVID year, the SFS YO continues making truly remarkable music!


